Unique features in eLibrary Elementary make it simple for schools and libraries to incorporate the millions of supplemental resources directly into instruction and research:

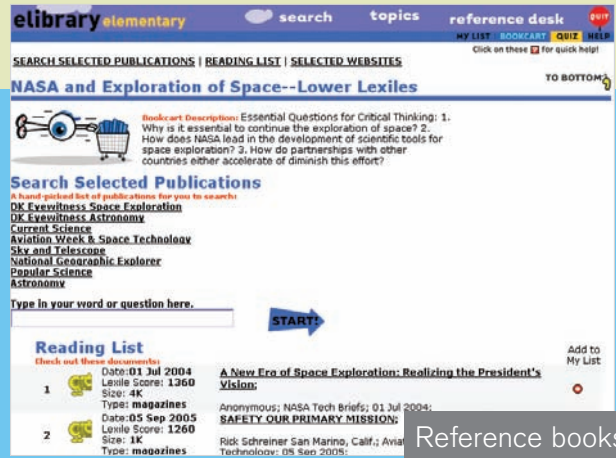

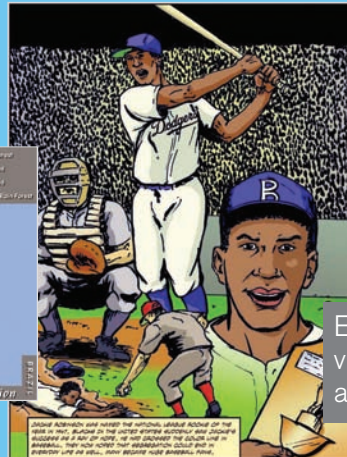
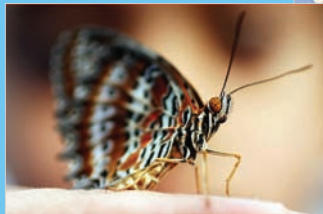
